Fancy Florals

Step into spring with bold blooms that are set to impress

This month, Keren Baker has designed a collection that will have you feeling inspired and ready to get the supplies out. Using a handful of shades and one die set, she has shown us how to make coordinated items that add a handmade touch to any gift, with a classic anemone flower adorning each piece.



Using a 7.5cm x 10.5cm tent folded white card blank, trim out a triangle from the bottom. Repeat the shape with a smaller layer of light yellow card.

 Assemble a pink flower using the dies and a set of leaves. Add to the tag using foam pads.

Stamp the sentiment onto a small section of white card and adhere to the tag. Punch a hole in the top left front of the tag.

Add a few Raindrops randomly to different areas of the flower and thread a piece of twine through the hole to complete the tag.

Floral Wreath

1 Create a circular card frame, and assemble nine flowers using pinks, oranges and yellows in different combinations.

2 Add the central black part at different angles. Die-cut sets of leaves, changing the order of the greens to make the leaves look different.

Arrange the flowers, overlapping them at regular intervals. When happy with the arrangement, adhere them to the card frame.





* To get an easy circular shape for the wreath, trace around a plate and trim out the centre. This makes lining up the flowers much easier.

* With flowers, you'd normally use darker colours towards the centre of the flowers, but use the opposite too; it adds more interest and reduces the amount of different coloured cardstock you need to use

* Add the black centres at different angles so it stops the flowers all looking the same.

Birthday Blooms

1 Take a white blank, 10.5cm x 21cm, and matt a slightly smaller layer of light green card to the front. Using the orange and pink shades, create three flowers.

Add the black centres at different angles. Die-cut three sets of leaves, alternating the order of colours to build up the leaf details. Fix a strip of yellow card to the top third of the blank, then add a small section of dark green card at the edge. Arrange the pink flower and leaves on the right side of the card.

Stamp the sentiment onto a small section of white card, adhering a dark green layer behind that. Add to the card using foam pads. Add a pink and orange flower towards the bottom, adding the orange flower using foam pads. Finish the card by adding raindrops randomly onto the project.
